Dear Urban Grace Community,

It has been quite a season and we are grateful for your presence throughout.

The **Building Together** Capital Campaign will soon be wrapping up as we each reflect on how we will participate in investing in our future together. For most of us, this will happen on December 3rd at Commitment Sunday. In worship on that day, we as a congregation will bring our commitment cards along with our regular offerings to dedicate them as our generous gifts to God's work through our church. If you are unable to attend worship, or are not ready to make your commitment by that date, a member of our campaign team will follow up with you to answer any questions about participation in our campaign.

We're at that point when each of us will soon be encouraged to offer financial commitments to our campaign. As we draw closer to making our commitments to resource the vital needs of our church, celebrate this opportunity to serve God with what has first been given to you.

Our campaign is about more than just finances. Ours is the privilege and opportunity to carry forward the legacy of our facilities, celebrate the abundance God places in our lives, and carry forward God's vision for us here. Thank God for what's been provided to you and for the opportunities yet to come.

O Sunday, December 3: Commitment Worship Service

After prayerful consideration, each of us will decide on the amount of our financial commitments to both our annual ministry (regular offering) and the **Building Together** Capital Campaign. Pledges to our capital campaign are above and beyond our regular offering and may be contributed as a one-time gift or in monthly, quarterly, or annual payments over the coming three years ending in December 2020. O January 2018: Commitment Follow-Up Visits

Because we hope to have a 100% response to our capital campaign, we will reach out to those who have not made a commitment by December 3rd. The purpose of these visits is to answer any questions, provide information, and receive each household's response.

We will share the results of the commitments received to date and give thanks to God for provisions in the life our church.

Reaching Our Goals

Our financial goals are set for our Building Together Campaign. Every dollar given will be a step forward toward bringing our vision to life. The more we're able to raise, the more we'll be able to accomplish toward taking care of the necessary facilities renovation projects.

Our campaign team has challenged us to consider generous financial commitments over and above our regular offerings in order to meet our campaign goal of raising a significant amount over the next three years. Please prayerfully consider the important part you play in helping meet this challenge. Everyone's gifts are needed!

FOUNDATION GOAL = \$225,000

Achieving this level will allow us to complete urgent repairs to the roof, masonry, and stained glass windows, replace our aging plumbing, and renovate our

FORMATION GOAL = \$350,000

Achieving this level will allow us to complete our Foundation Goal projects AND renovate the sanctuary, upgrade the Lower Temple kitchen, and replace carpeting on the first floor.

PINNACLE GOAL = \$500,000

Achieving this level will allow us to complete our Formation Goal projects AND restore the Lower Temple ceiling, install new sanctuary lighting, and replace carpeting on the second floor.

The Joy of Generosity

Our church family does a wonderful job of being stewards of their resources. We are all enticed to buy new things. New cars, new homes, new clothes. These new things can bring excitement and are sometimes necessary, but we know that Scripture teaches that we learn the joy that comes from generous giving, rather than through the accumulation of things or the abundance of material possessions. In 2 Corinthians 8 and 9, the apostle Paul makes it clear that the Corinthian people's giving to the church in Jerusalem is just as important to their

people's giving to the church in Jerusalem is just as important to their own spiritual welfare as it is for the physical welfare of the Christians in Jerusalem. Paul emphasizes three important concepts:

1) Give voluntarily, give joyfully, and give first to the Lord. "God loves it when the giver delights in the giving!" (II Corinthians 9:7b)

2) Give as a way to thank God for provisions. Different members of our congregation have different circumstances and different experiences. Giving to our campaign is a way to thank God for what's been provided to you by supporting God's work at Urban Grace in whatever way you are able to be generous.

3) Trust in God to provide for your needs. "God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of every-thing, you may share abundantly in every good work." (II Corinthians 9:8)


